1. <u>Emergency Exit parking on Dere Street</u> The Clerk stated that she had just had a response from a Louise

3. <u>Crow Wood Treehouse</u>

The parish councillors were made aware of the treehouse that had been built in Crow Wood. Cllr AB stated it was very study and understood a resident of Leeming had built it for his grandchildren to play in. However, this had been built without prior permission and any accidents would fall back on the parish.

Councillors had a long and frank discussion about this item.

The clerk suggested that she requested Matthew Day from Streetscape to look at the structure to gain if it complies with all British Regulations.

6. Bus Stop Exelby / Leeming

Cllr Temple stated that several vehicles are still parking outside the Bus stops in both villages.

A discussion by councillors suggested that perhaps designated road markings could be adopted and requested from Highways so busses can stop at correctly not in the middle of the road and that passengers can alight or get on the buses safely.

Cllr Temple also wanted confirmation from Passenger transport that the bus company is now using the stop as when it was being monitored it appeared children are still congregating on the main road.
