Appendix A

Question / Residents response	Answers from Enviromena
1. What is an EIA?	An EIA Screening Application is as previously stated not usually required for a Solar Farm because they are treated as temporary projects. An EIA would usually have input from stakeholders like NYC Highways, Environment, Paths, and various other agencies. Some local parishes have asked for an EIA in the past, but it has seemed not relevant. However, it does give a full impact and details around the use of the sites.
2. How can 40 years be temporary?	This is a national Policy not one we have procured. The only long-term structure would be the small substation. This has also been known to be removed if required on other projects.
3. Can you elaborate on the Carbon Figures?	These will be made available on the full planning application.
4. What happens after 40 years?	The exact same process is required for us to continue to use the land in question.
5. Won't that be easier for you to get use?	We will need to go through the same hoops, and I do not think it will be any easier.
6. Can you advise if the Substation will need foundations / size/ etc?	 Yes, we anticipate this will need foundations as we are planning a brick building on the site. However, that may change, and it may be like one of those metal containers like the energy companies use. This is still under consideration. The structure will be a max of 2mtrs high.
7. You stated when we talked earlier about 30MHz output on site with use for 14K homes? Will this be local homes?	7. We cannot guarantee the electricity will be used locally. It will go into the national grid. The calculations are a national formula provided by government agency sites.

8. The electricity usage details provided are not correct and the usage for the future will far outreach any figures provided by the government. So how can a nett zero timescale be meet?	I can only refer you to the figures provided in the documentation.
9. What is a Power Purchase Agreement and is this the same as an energy PPA? Output Description:	A solar PPA is different from the utility companies PPA.
10. Which areas within Ropner Estate where you informed to look at or were you advised to look at this site?	10. We were advised that 70% of the estate was B3 Graded agricultural land and of that land we could decide which was the best option. We know that you can grow on B3 land, but it is not the best for farming.
11. What about the farmhouse in the middle of the development?	11. We have had a number of discussions with the owners of the property to ensure everything possible is being done to provide the least impact on their home.
12. Your communications are incorrect because I have had only one conversation on the phone to you in January.	12. We have talked and visited on numerous occasions.
You are telling lies. Your communication system is non-existent.	
13. Can we have English not abbreviations?	13. Sorry. Yes, we are so used to using acronyms.
What are those red shapes on the plans?	Those are the expected sites of the substations.
14. You stipulated that the land is grade B3 but as you can see the land is used to produce tons of wheat on the photos we provided?	14. Grade B3 is land that can be used to farm but it is not the best grade land.
15. Has Sir Henry thought about the Solar Farm outside his own house?	15. I cannot answer that first question.
There are acres of Brown land around the area that can be used rather than this area?	Sir Henry provided the list of areas that as stated were Grade B3 and of those areas we had the opportunity to decide which was the most suitable.
16. Why did you select the land that surrounds this family home?	16. This was the best area for us. We have as stated tried to communicate with the owners and have adjusted our plans to try and modify the plans, so they are not inconvenienced.

17. There has been no consultation, and you know that.	17. We have spoken on more than one occasion.
18. Can you advise if the Thorpe Perrow landowners are present?	18. I do not think they are.
19. Have you really considered the detrimental issues to the wildlife – bees etc?	19. Enviromena has always considered a very high base line for the consideration of all plant and bird life in any of our projects. The nett change is usually less than 10% but no higher than 50%. All the work we do will ensure where possible the wildlife is protected as much as possible.
20. What about the deer in the area?	20. There is plenty of other farmland in the area for deer and other animals to use. No response
You cannot push them into a small, corralled area, these are wild animals.	The Toopenise
21. Why agricultural land and not Brown land	21. We are dictated by which land we can use by the landowners who are willing to allow Solar on their land.
22. Can I ask about the access route for the site shown on your maps. I understand the construction trucks are 38Ton and will go from the A6055 over Flood Bridge which is not able to take that weight and is already a single line traffic passing area that is a black spot for accidents? Then put the solar panels on rooftops and not areas that is not suitable to get equipment to or maintain.	22. We have put that as the initial route but will obviously be guided by Highways on the Full Planning Application and change the route if required. We want to ensure we comply with all road regulations.
23. Will we see all the maps and how you choose this particular piece of land?	23. No.
24. Were you directed to this area by the Landowner?	24. As previously stated, we were provided with certain areas to which we could choose the best option for us.
25. What are the orange dots on the maps?	25. These are the substations as advised, previously.
26. How big are these and how many pylons?	26. There are no pylons as everything is underground. The panel themselves are about the size of a single storey building.

27. Access on roads that are regular used by wheelchair users from Mowbray School.	27. They will have the right to object and provide reasons why they do not wish the project to go forward.
28. Local use as paths	28. The same as just stated.
